6	Group work	Starting from participants projects, discussion on the possible designs
7	Lecture	Meeting the constraints:  - Determining the needed sample size - Organizing the surveys - Dealing with attrition - Menaces to validity (internal & external)
8	Individual exercise	Under the supervision of the professor, participants are asked to draft a list of issues to solve in order to complete their project proposals as well as an action plan to address them (persons to contact, questions to clarify, etc.).
